Registered Nurse – Diabetes Education Program Temporary Full-time

Position Summary:

Reporting to the Director of Clinical Services the individual will be responsible for providing assessment, education, and support to individuals of all ages including their families/supports affected by diabetes. Working in collaboration with a multidisciplinary team of Physician, Registered Dietician and Registered Social Workers in an outpatient setting. Providing individual consultation, group education classes, and access to specialized diabetes services including diabetes and pregnancy counselling, a provincially designated paediatric diabetes program, and an insulin pump program. To develop, implement, and evaluate nursing care plans for people with diabetes.

Position Requirements:

- * Current registration with the College of Nurses of Ontario and in good standing required.
- * Certified Diabetes Educator (CDE) or working towards certification is required.
- * Recent experience (within the last 2 years) in Diabetes Education for adults and children required.
- * Experience in developing diabetes educational resources and programs for both adults and children.
- * Knowledge of adult and paediatric teaching and learning principles combined with recent teaching experience with the diabetes population is required.
- * Certified Insulin Pump Trainer and training in adult and children populations required.
- * A member of the Educator Section of the Canadian Diabetes Association would be considered an asset.
- * Must have the ability to organize work according to priorities and to adjust this prioritization as required.
- * Must have excellent assessment, communication (verbal and written) and observational skills.
- * Must be able to perform physical demands of the position.
- * Must have the ability to work independently and collaboratively with all members of the multidisciplinary team, clients, families, regional support services, and community partners.
- * Must have the ability to provide health teaching to individuals and groups.
- * Must have the ability to assume responsibility for patient care in a total patient care climate.
- * Must have a good work ethic and work record demonstrating regular attendance at work.
- * Must be able to meet the physical demands required to provide nursing care to all patients.

- * Must have had at least two doses of the COVID-19 vaccine.
